

What To Do if You Smell Gas in Your Housing Unit

- Take your children and pets and leave the apartment right away
- Do not use your phone (even a cell phone) on the premises. A phone could also create a spark.
- · Do not light a match, candle, stove, lighter or turn on a light switch, Do not turn electrical appliance on or off. This could cause a spark that would cause the GAS to ignite.
- Exit the unit immediately. If you live in a duplex, tell your neighbor to do the same. Get as far away as possible, and call the housing authority.
- Call the Lebanon Housing Authorities after hours emergency phone line 615.829.4026 only when you are a safe distance away.
- Don't go back into the building or the area until a housing authority representative or emergency on site personnel has informed you that it is safe.

When temperatures are below freezing. Please do the following:

- Open your kitchen cabinet doors at night
- Leave the hot and cold water dripping in all sinks, and tub



- Make sure your bathroom and kitchen windows are closed
- Leave your water dripping when you leave your home

Failure to do the following may result in your pipes bursting.

Reminders:

- When coming into the office please remember you must wear a mask. Also, in order to see your property manager you must schedule an appointment. If you are requesting information from your property manager you can either email your property manager or come to the office and request. This request will be processed within 24 hours.
- Residents are failing to report changes in income or changes in family composition. It is extremely important to report changes to avoid possibly receiving retroactive rent.
- Please do not provide homes on your porch for stray cats or dogs on the property. We are asking that you do not feed them, this also causes a problem with feeding possible rodents.

Monthly Maintenance Tip

Hello LHA Family, its winter now and time to start thinking about energy conservation and safety, now that you are going from cooling your apartment to now heating it here are some things you need to know.

Energy Conservation - To save on energy cost during the winter months you should have all window a/c units removed and put them in storage for the winter. The Department of Energy statistics say that you can have as much as a 20-30% heat loss through a/c units if they are left in place and 10% though windows that are not closed securely. Please make sure all windows are closed properly to prevent air from coming in around the sash and keep the doors closed as much as possible.

Safety - The Lebanon Housing Authority want to keep you and your Family safe, for this reason we have installed First Alert Smoke Alarms and combination Smoke/Carbon Monoxide Alarms in your apartment, as we were in the process of cleaning and lighting your gas heaters, we found several Carbon Monoxide Alarms had for one reason or another been taken down. The Lebanon Housing Authority maintenance department wants all Tenants to know, when you remove the Smoke/Carbon Monoxide Alarm you are putting your family and your neighbors in danger therefore you will be charged for the Alarm and vandalism for removing LHA property help us keep everyone safe, so if there is a problem call Maintenance don't try to do it yourself.
