What To Do if You Smell Gas in Your Housing Unit

- Take your children and pets and leave the apartment right away
- Do not use your phone (even a cell phone) on the premises. A phone could also create a spark.
- Do not light a match, candle, stove, lighter or turn on a light switch, Do not turn electrical appliance on or off. This could cause a spark that would cause the GAS to ignite.
- Exit the unit immediately. If you live in a duplex, tell your neighbor to do the same. Get as far away as possible, and call the housing authority.
- Call the Lebanon Housing Authorities after hours emergency phone line 615.829.4026 only when you are a safe distance away.
- Don't go back into the building or the area until a housing authority representative or emergency on site personnel has informed you that it is safe.

"Seven whole days and not a word from you" are the words from one of Toni Braxton hits songs. Coincidently, it has been seven whole years (7 ½) since I began serving as

your Executive Director and this is my first article in the Lebanon Housing Authority's Newsletter.

Some Past Happenings

Much has been accomplished and much more improvement is planned. For example, LHA has attempted to rehab the interior of some of units aged over 60 years old with new color-scheme paint, LED lighting, vinyl plank flooring, new cabinets/countertops, new water heaters and Heat Pumps (Parkview, Hillcrest, Watertown, and one-bed rooms in Head Homes). You have been patient to allow your yard to be in disarray for new water and sewer lines in every development (most recently Inman Court and Parkview Homes). New playground equipment has been installed in Watertown, Head Homes, and Upton Heights. Over these years, we have tried to increase security by installing more outside lighting and cameras to reduce crime. More parking and resurfacing of the lots in the upper and middle loops of Upton Heights. We have installed throughout our complexes dual smoke and

Present Happenings

Last month LHA conducted our annual Property and Pest Control Assessment. We hired an independent company and our Pest Control vendor to inspect each building and unit for damages, blockages, bed bugs and pest. Since early 2020, the COVID-19 pandemic prevented us from inspections and routine work orders, I held my breath not knowing what the results would be. Surprisingly, many units did not have any issues!!! Almost 100 emergency issues like blocked egress and non-functioning smoke-carbon monoxide detectors. The maintenance staff is working feverishly to make needed repairs. Please note: workorders that are the result of tenant damage will result in charges.

Future Happenings

It is our intention to open the Dr. Roderick Burton Building as soon as we update some of the technology. Our goal is July or August 2021. I want to organize a resident council that comprises representatives from all seven developments to seek comments and ideas from residents. This council will meet once a month. I have instructed the property managers to implement this in July or August 2021.

As some of you know, LHA is pursuing a HUD program called RAD (Rental Assistance Demonstration) which converts PHAs (Section 9 program) to a more financially stable platform like Section 8 program. There is really no difference for renters. For the past 4-5 months, physical need and environmental (Radon, Lead, and Asbestos)

assessments have been conducted. We currently are reviewing the reports. This is part of the process to determine if we need or can afford to convert. The ultimate reason for converting is that it will give LHA the ability to obtain loans for major capital improvements.

On June 11, LHA applied for Disaster Low-Income Housing Tax Credits (LIHTC) worth approximately \$11 million with the Tennessee Housing and Development Agency (THDA). If approved, it will allow LHA to demolish old units and to construct new units. The targeted areas are Upton Heights (Areas 1 & 3 or Inman Court (Areas 2 & 4). I will try to communicate better through our newsletter and not wait seven more years but each month to update HOUSING HAPPENINGS!! Have a great and safe July,

Air Conditioners

Air conditioners will be installed on a case by case basis depending upon the temperature. When you call your work order into the office, you must inform the office of you telephone number.

Maintenance will call and schedule placement of the air conditioner. Please place your air conditioner by the window in which you want it installed.

*Please be mindful if you have two windows in your bedroom, one must remain unblocked in case of fire. Please do not install air conditioners in your window because it may cause damage to your unit and you will be held liable for that damage. Also, HUD does not consider installation of air conditioners an emergency.

Residents of the Lebanon Housing Authority I know that I am always informing you about the dangers of too much Natural Gas Exposure (the smell of rotten eggs), but now I want to tell you about the

dangers associated with exposure to Carbon Monoxide (CO). This potential danger is generated from the incomplete burning of gas in appliances or improper ventilation such as (wall heaters/stoves). Carbon Monoxide is an invisible and odorless gas that can be produced in your unit's heater, stove, and water heater. A few symptoms associated with exposure can be a headache, nausea, dizziness, and flu-like symptoms. If you ever feel these symptoms you need to get everyone out of the unit, go across the street, and call the LHA emergency number at 615-829-4026 or 911. The LHA Maintenance staff will respond and perform air testing to ensure there is not an issue in your units' equipment.
