Change Is in the Air!

Transformations & Updates at LHA

As we approach one year since President Trump appointed a new HUD Secretary, we have witnessed significant administrative changes that have impacted public housing and various aspects of our society. While some changes were

necessary, others have posed challenges to the economy and the daily lives of many vulnerable residents. In light of these adjustments, I urge everyone to adhere to your lease agreements and all related regulations. Given the rising cost of housing across the nation, it is crucial not to risk eviction during this time.

The LHA staff and I are committed to keeping up with regulation changes, and we have worked diligently to provide training and adjust our policies accordingly. Notably, we have developed a new LHA Admissions and Continued Occupancy Policy (ACOP) and an updated lease, both of which are available for your review in the main office lobby. These documents are scheduled for adoption at the December 2025 Commissioners' meeting. If you have any questions, please reach out to your property manager. Thank you for your patience as we strive to enhance the living conditions for all residents and improve our community.

Major Construction and Community Improvements

Among the most visible changes is the ongoing construction on the southern border of Upton Heights, where the new Wilson County Courthouse is being built. This large-scale project has required the closure of Rogers, resulting in changes to neighborhood traffic patterns. On the northern border, construction is underway for three new buildings that will house 52 residents. Most of these units will be made available through Project Based Vouchers (PBV) and the Low-Income Housing Tax Credit (LIHTC) program. We anticipate completing the first building between April and May 2026, and these will consist of two and three bedroom units. Further information about these developments will be shared in early 2026. Additionally, final plans to renovate and expand the LHA Maintenance building are expected to be submitted soon in order to secure a contractor this month.

Infrastructure and Safety Enhancements

The completed construction of Hartsville Pike, now renamed Hazelwood Pike, has increased traffic into Inman Court (McGregor Street). We have brought this issue to the city's attention, and in the meantime, we are doing everything possible to maintain safety. Both the Upton Heights and Inman Court developments, which feature barrack-style buildings, have contracts in place to replace shingles and porch roofs. At the Watertown apartments, important interior modernization is underway, including the installation of new cabinets and flooring.

- Finish framing, begin roofing and MEP rough-in for 712 Lake St.
- Begin drywall installation for 714 Lake St.
- Pour the slab for 716 Lake St.
- Start framing for 716 Lake St.
- · Finish working on stormwater and drains.
- Community Bldg. footings will begin once we have more site working area. Right now, it looks like mid-December.

Re-Roofing at Upton Heights and Inman Court Project to start in December

 Roof replacement will begin in December at Upton Heights and Inman Courts. This project will have a schedule for the next 8 to 12 weeks. Work will begin at Upton Heights with 24 units to be completed. Work will then move to Inman Court with 34 units to be completed. New roofing will match the re-roofing project that was completed on several units last year.

Winter is upon us, and it's getting cold! Here's some common wintertime cold injuries.


Hypothermia occurs when the body loses heat faster than it can produce it, causing dangerously low temperatures. Frostbite occurs when body tissue—like fingers, toes, the nose, or ears—freezes. Let's explore their causes, preventions, and treatments.

Causes

- Prolonged exposure to cold temperatures
- · Inadequate clothing
- Certain medical conditions, such as hypothyroidism or hypoglycemia
- Alcohol or drug intoxication
- Physical exhaustion can make the body less efficient at regulating temperature.
- Some medications, such as beta-blockers, can increase the risk.

Prevention

- Dress in warm, dry layers, including a hat, gloves, and waterproof boots
- · Change out of wet clothing promptly.
- Avoid alcohol and drugs before and during cold exposure and temperatures.
- Be aware of your surroundings and take breaks indoors if needed.



Hypothermia Treatment

- Call for emergency help:
 Hypothermia is a medical emergency
- Get the person to a warm, dry location as quickly as possible.
- Removing wet clothing and wrapping the person in blankets or warm, dry clothes.
- Place warm items like hot water bottles or heating pads (wrapped in a towel or blanket) in the armpits, groin, and neck areas.
- Provide warm fluids: Avoid alcohol and caffeine.
- Avoid certain actions: Do not massage the body. Avoid warming the person too quickly.

Frostbite Treatment

- Call for medical help: Frostbite is a medical emergency
- Gently rewarm the affected area by soaking it in warm (not hot) water for 15-30 minutes. The water should feel comfortably warm.
- Do not massage the affected skin, as this can cause further tissue damage.
- After rewarming, cover the area with sterile gauze or a clean cloth. Avoid breaking any blisters that may have formed.
- Do not use direct heat sources like heating pads, heat lamps, or a fireplace to warm the area, as this can cause burns.
- Seek professional care: A healthcare provider may recommend antibiotics for infection, a tetanus shot, pain medication, or surgery in severe cases.

Although they are different, it is possible to have both injuries at the same time, typically below 32°F (0°C). And remember, wet clothing can accelerate heat loss and increase the risk of frostbite and hypothermia. Be sure to stay safe & warm!
